

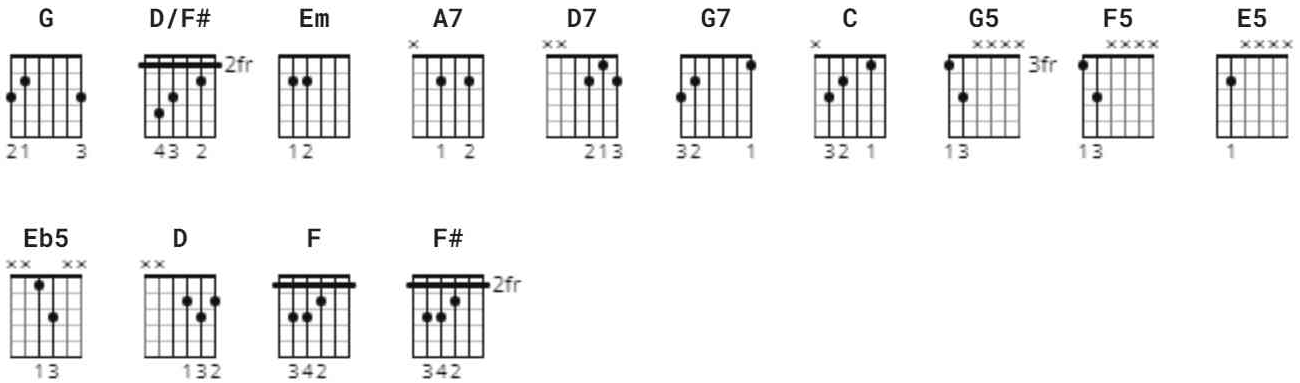

Difficulty: intermediate

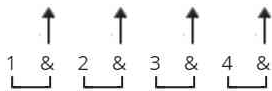
